Campus Development

The College is embarking on an £84 million capital investment, delivering state of the art campuses on the current sites in Union Street, Coleraine and Farm Lodge, Ballymena. The projects are funded by the Department for the Economy.

Coleraine

There will be a new, purposebuilt campus on the existing (but extended) site at Union Street Coleraine, due to open in 2022. The innovation zone will be a flexible area that can be adapted for a wide range of activities including cross curriculum project based learning and conferences. The training restaurant and hair and beauty salon will, at set times, be open to the public to provide our students with the opportunity to train in a realistic environment. The College plans also include the sympathetic refurbishments of the former St Patrick's Church Parish Centre as a the stand alone performing arts centre for the new campus.

From September 2020, during the 2 year rebuild period, a small number of courses will be delivered at the Ballymoney Campus with the remaining at Beresford Avenue, Coleraine, each location playing an important role in maintaining the College curriculum offering.

Ballymena

Our plans are for one campus for Ballymena with a new build on the existing Farm Lodge site, with the closure of Trostan Avenue and Lamont Building. The new campus is scheduled to open in September 2024.

Digital Learning

On many of our courses teaching is delivered partly online and can be completed at home or on campus. We have invested heavily in online teaching facilities and computer equipment to provide our students with a high quality learning experience.

We are continually refining, expanding and enhancing our online course delivery, offering the flexibility of studying parts of your course online.

This means you can:

- Access course material online 24/7

In addition to course materials provided by our lecturers, all students at Northern Regional College have access to online resources in topics such as employability, IT and study skills developed by industry experts.

Fees and Funding

The College has a dedicated Student Finance team who can provide you with support and assistance with applying for funding to support your studies and in accessing any additional College funds.

Where courses have additional mandatory expenses we make every effort to highlight them in the online prospectus. These may include uniforms, kits, IrishFA registration, residential visits, field trips, materials, security checks, computer equipment.

EMA

Traineeship/Further Education students aged between 16 and 19 may be entitled to receive a weekly EMA (Education Maintenance Allowance) payment of £30. This award is means-tested on household income.

Travel Pass

Students aged 19 or younger on 1 July and on a full-time Further Education/Traineeship course may apply for a Travel Pass or travel allowance. Other criteria and age restrictions may apply and you should contact the Education Authority for further information.

Further Education Award

Students enrolled on a Further Education course must be 19 or older on 1 July. This is a means tested award for full-time students and usually has a closing date. Early application is recommended. Other criteria and age restrictions may apply and you should contact the Education Authority for further information.

Access to Learning Fund

Students must be 18 or older at the start of the academic year. Assistance is means tested and students must have applied to all other sources of finance that are available to them in the first instance. This fund is administered by the College. Application criteria are available upon request.

Care to Learn Scheme

If you have care of a child then you may be able to get help with childcare and travel costs. You must be aged between 16 and 19 at the start of the course. This fund is administered by the College.

Childcare Assistance

Help with childcare costs may be available to both further and higher education students through Student Finance NI.

Other Sources of Help

There may be other sources of support available to you, such as free school meals, or the Disabled Student Allowance. Please refer to our website for further details.

Accreditation of Prior Experiential Learning

Where mature students wish to have prior education and/or experience taken into account, in lieu of meeting the full course entry requirements, they should contact the relevant Course Director by 10 August, as an application deadline will apply. Applicants must also refer to further details available online.

Apprenticeships

What is an **Apprenticeship?**

Apprentices are employed as full-time members of staff and typically work three davs a week. Up to two davs a week are spent at College. studying for nationallyrecognised gualifications in the same profession as the apprenticeship.

- It might be possible to do an apprenticeship with a current employer
- You work all vear round. but your College classes run from September to Julv
- Employers pay you for the days you are in College, meaning you will receive a full-time wage in accordance with the national minimum wage

ApprenticeshipsNI Course Details

Apprenticeships offer training to people aged 16 and over who are employed for a minimum of 21 hours per week. Restrictions apply for those over 25.

Training

Your training support officer will meet with you and your employer to discuss your training needs and develop a training programme for you.

Timetable

Usually you are with your employer three days a week and at College up to two days a week.

Apprenticeships are offered from Level 2 to Level 3 with Higher Level Apprenticeships from Around 600 apprentices train Level 5 upwards. Level 2 is the level that most new apprentices will start on. Depending on your broader range of professions. ability and qualifications you may be able to start at Level 3. Once you complete Level 3 you may be able to progress to a Higher Level Apprenticeship.

What is a Higher Level Apprenticeship?

A Higher Level Apprenticeship (HLA) is a nationally accredited workbased programme similar to traditional apprenticeships but at a higher level (Level 5). It is designed to meet the needs of employers for higher skill levels and leads to gualifications equivalent to university level.

Advice on how to secure an employer for an apprenticeship

Before starting your apprenticeship you must secure full-time employment. Below are some guidelines to assist you:

- Consider working with a suitable employer over the summer months to give you a better insight into the industry in which you are thinking of a career
- Remember to check that you are adequately covered by the employer's insurance, and that you have also received suitable Health & Safety training
- Phone, email or arrange to meet with as many local companies/employers as you can and remember to have an updated curriculum vitae (CV) ready to hand over, post, or email to employers

- Contact your local Careers Service, school careers teacher or a member of our College careers team to get useful information on your chosen career as well as help in preparing your CV
- You can contact a Department for the Economy (DfE) careers advisor by phone, Monday to Friday 9.00am to 5.00pm Tel: 0300 200 7820
- Scan your local press job section and online job sites for companies advertising apprenticeship opportunities, especially during summer months

How to Apply

Visit **nrc.ac.uk***

Find the course you are applying to. Add course to shortlist and select apply now.

Create an account with a unique login using a personal email address and password (do not use your school email address). You must check your online account regularly for updates and communications about your application.

Complete and submit your application. You will receive an automatic reply by email.

You will be invited to an information event and may subsequently be made a conditional offer. For apprenticeships you may be required to complete an aptitude test. You must also bring along a copy of your National Insurance Number and proof of ID along with your results.

Conditional offers are subject to you meeting the specified entry requirements and any other criteria. In a small number of courses, enhanced criteria may be used in instances of over subscription to courses. Where this happens, enhanced criteria will be published in advance.

If you have been issued with a conditional offer you will be invited to the College to enrol. If you have not met the conditions of your offer, you will be signposted to an alternative course. If you no longer wish to take up your place at the College, you can withdraw your application at any time via the admissions portal.



Earlier this year, Jack was runner up in the animation category at the Inter-Colleges media competition with his 'Zombie News Report' and was the highest-achieving student in his class at the College's awards ceremony. Following on from this success. Jack completed a Level 3 in Interactive Media with triple distinction grade and was awarded a JP McManus scholarship worth over 22K towards his undergraduate degree in Animation at Ulster University. As a recipient of the JP McManus scholarship he will receive £5,550 per year toward his fees and other expenses during the four-year course.

Jack Bradshaw Level 3 in Interactive Media Calum, an apprentice with Braid Electrical Services, won Apprentice of the Year at the Northern Ireland Electrical Awards.

"I've always tried, both in College and on-site, to achieve the very highest standards, in everything I do," said Calum. "It's great to have all that hard work and effort recognised with an award like this one."

Calum McAuley Level 3 in Electrical Installation Samuel, carpentry and joinery apprentice won a top European award crowning him Best Apprentice. Winning this award is the latest achievement for Samuel who won the Northern Ireland Young Apprentice of the Year in 2018 and a gold medallist at the UK National Finals of WorldSkills UK Live 2018.

"I never expected to even be nominated for this award. I was shocked and completely speechless. I have learned an incredible amount from both my tutor lan Forsythe at the College and my employer Mark Pollock.

Samuel Gilmore Level 3 in Carpentry & Joinery Having completed his AS Levels at Coleraine Grammar, Sam decided that being back at school wasn't for him so he enrolled on the Level 3 in Business course at the College. He is enjoying the freedom of studying at the College as it allows him to balance his study with working part-time. He explains,

"Studying the Level 3 Diploma is a really good stepping stone to going on to university. The lecturers are there to give support if needed but independent learning is good as it will prepare me for university. The structure of the course and the way you have to do coursework instead of exams is another plus."

Some friends who were a year ahead of Sam had completed the course and recommended it.

"It was the best decision I have made and I am now more focused. I want to study Business at a higher level and plan to go onto to the HNC and then the Degree in Business at the College's Ballymena campus.

"I could have staved on at school Caitlin was "delighted" to have been selected for the JP McManus scholarship and said stress. Studying Level 3 Travel it was the "icing on the cake" of a fantastic time at the College.

Louis Bell, a recent graduate of the College's Professional Cookery apprenticeship scheme delivered in partnership with Galgorm Spa and Golf Resort, landed a dream job within the Castle Golf Club restaurant at the luxury resort. As an apprentice, Louis spent four days each week in the resort's busy kitchens and one day a week studying at the College's Ballymena campus. Louis decided to leave school after doing his AS-Levels and pursue his career as a chef.

"Looking back, it was definitely the right decision for me. I couldn't have learned everything I have by just being in a classroom. I have been able to work my way up from prep chef to performing restaurant service," he says.

Louis has been able to gain experience in three different kitchens at the Galgorm and has praised the "supportive head chefs" in each of them.

Theory-based learning at the College's Ballymena campus was also part of his apprenticeship and, although he was initially sceptical about how useful this would be, Louis admits:

"I wouldn't change a thing about the course, or my experience."
